

Placenames

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Placenames have evolved and changed over time and the modern spellings of **Teversal** and its hamlets of **Stanley, Whiteborough, Dunsil, Fackley and Newbound Mill** are no exception - as shown by charters, manuscripts and official documents through the ages. '**Teveshalt**' is recorded in the Domesday book of 1086 and at the time of the Norman conquest in 1066 it is shown to have a Saxon landowner named Leoffric.

The hamlets in **Teversal parish** are derived from both Celtic and Old English (Anglo-Saxon) words and names:-

Teversal - The Celtic word 'terfyn' and 'halt' translates as 'boundary stronghold'. Teversal stands on a spur of land which would have been a strategic military position. It is currently on the Nottinghamshire/Derbyshire border but an ancient boundary also existed between the kingdoms of Mercia and Pecsæta (South Peak) - a part of the Kingdom of Northern Britain known as Elmet in the 6th century.

Stanley - 'stan' meaning stony and 'ley' meaning clearing would have been a 'stony clearing in the forest'

Whiteborough - Anglo-Saxon burgh is town and the Marl pits here would have made the land appear white

Dunsil- 'dun' is a fort—on a hill -the hill survives though there is no evidence of a fort here!

Fackley - the first part is possibly 'falod' meaning animal enclosure and 'ley' meaning clearing. Fackley bridge is where the River Meden goes beneath the road at the bottom of Meden bank forming part of the Teversal boundary


